Article 58. (1) Individuals who are in transit and temporary residents within the territory of Bulgaria may carry medical products containing narcotic substances						

listed in Schedules under items 2 and 3 of para 2 under Art. 3 of this Act only for the purpose of medical treatment and in quantities not exceeding those needed for a thirtyday treatment. (2) In the cases referred to in Paragraph 1, foreign nationals shall hold a proper document issued by the competent authorities of the country where the said treatment has been prescribed. Article 59. Bulgarian nationals, as well as permanent or temporary foreign residents in Bulgaria, travelling abroad may carry, for personal use medical products containing narcotic substances listed in Schedules under items 2 and 3 of para 2 under Art. 3 of this Act in quantities not exceeding those needed for a thirty-day treatment. (2) In the cases referred to in Paragraph 1, the travelling person shall hold a permit issued by the Minister of Health, or by an official from the specialized administration of the Ministry of Health, authorized by the Minister. (3) The permit under Paragraph 2 shall be issued to the person after the latter submitted to the specialized administration the following: 1. an application; 2. an identification document; 3. a document attesting to the necessary daily dose and the treatment protocol. (4) The issued permit under paragraph 2 shall be valid for the period of the journey abroad which shall be recorded in the permit. (5) Medicinal products containing narcotic substances under Paragraph 1 may be carried only by the persons to whom the permit under paragraph 2 has been issued. (6) When travelling persons are under age and minors data from an identity document of a parent/guardian shall be required which shall be recorded in the permit.
